Girl tumbles out third-floor window after falling from bunk-bed ladder

Neighbours are crediting a homemade wooden table with saving the life of a fiveyear-old girl who fell from a third-storey window.

The girl was playing with siblings in a bedroom on the third floor of an apartment building in the 500 block of Cranford Dr. S.E. around 9:30 p.m. Tuesday when she fell off a bunk bed ladder and crashed through a screened window, according to neighbours.

The girl fell three storeys, landing on a wooden table and also hitting a pair of bicycle handlebars before rolling off the table and landing on a cement deck next to a large trailer hitch. "That table saved her life," said Jason Hamzeh, who lives on the ground floor of the building and rushed to the girl's aid after hearing a loud crash.

"I heard a big thump and saw the screen on the ground but didn't see the girl at first.

"My neighbour was looking around too then we saw her under the table."

That neighbour was Michael Messier, who built the table several years ago.

"I thought a barbecue fell it was so loud," he said.

"I'm glad I kept (the table) there because I was actually going to move it the day before to throw it out. It's just a table we built years ago."
